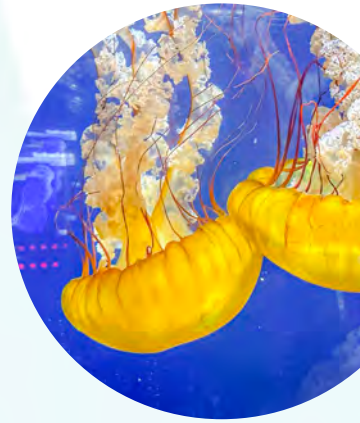

I first became involved with the Aquarium in 2022 through the Citizen Scientist Dive Program, where my daughter Avery and I actively contributed to kelp removal efforts in Monterey Bay and participated in tunnel dives within the aquarium. Our passion for marine conservation runs deep, and in November 2023, Avery, at just 13 years old, broke the Guinness World Record for the most magic tricks performed underwater in three minutes—an inspiring achievement accomplished right here at the Aquarium of the Bay.

Despite the challenges we have faced, we remain steadfast in our mission. Thanks to the hard work of our leadership team and the generosity of key supporters like Raymond Lane, Seven Post, and the Draper Foundation, we successfully raised \$1 million during the quiet phase of our fundraising efforts to stabilize operations. However, our work is far from over.

We are excited to share that we have recently signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Yale University's School of the Environment, reinforcing our commitment to marine conservation and education. Our focus is on developing impactful programs that position the Aquarium of the Bay as the premier destination for marine education and conservation in the Bay Area. Through strategic partnerships and program enhancements, we aim to inspire future generations while advancing critical research and conservation efforts.

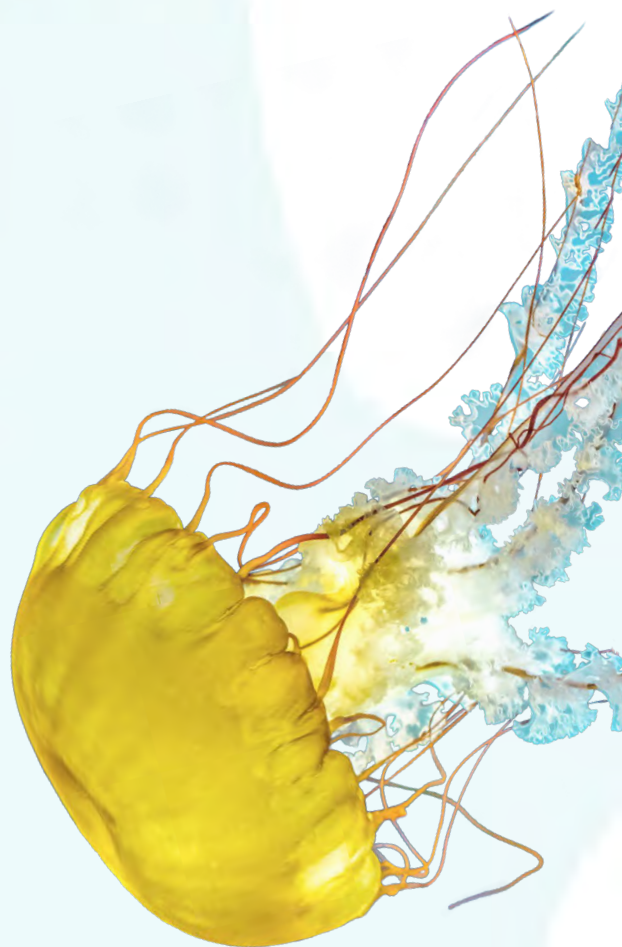

Throughout the school year, our team offers exciting classes and programs for Bay Area schools, leads VIP tours, and supports special events, all with the goal of leaving a lasting, positive impact.

At the Aquarium of the Bay, we're committed to applying the best practices in informal education to further our mission. We carefully design programs that reflect the latest research from top organizations while weaving in captivating, relatable stories that highlight the importance of conservation. The Animal Care Department is dedicated to ensuring the health and well-being of our entire living collection. Every aspect of the ecosystems we showcase is carefully maintained to foster perfect harmony, from preserving water quality to closely monitoring the health and behavior of each species. We carefully regulate key factors like temperature, pH, and salinity to create stable, thriving environments. Each species receives personalized care when it comes to feeding—whether it's target feeding our playful river otters or broadcast feeding the vibrant fish in our Shark Tunnel.

In line with our commitment to sustainability, the Aquarium proudly uses sustainably sourced seafood to nourish our diverse animals. By choosing seafood from responsible sources, we play an active role in protecting marine ecosystems, reducing overfishing, and supporting healthier fish populations. This practice reflects our core mission of conservation and education, helping us minimize the environmental impact of the seafood industry while encouraging broader positive change through certified sustainable fisheries.



## Endangered Sunflower Sea Star

The Aquarium of the Bay is excited to play a key role in the conservation efforts to save the critically endangered sunflower sea star (*Pycnopodia helianthoides*) through aquaculture programs. These initiatives focus on restoring populations devastated by sea star wasting disease, with the goal of reestablishing this keystone species as a vital predator in kelp forest ecosystems. Many organizations are already making great strides to boost the sunflower sea star's population and genetic diversity, and the Aquarium of the Bay is eager to contribute to this vital work.

Behind the scenes, the Aquarium is currently renovating an aquaculture space designed to cultivate sunflower sea stars, with plans to begin their care and breeding in the coming years. By joining forces with other leading aquariums and marine institutes, the Aquarium of the Bay is committed to preserving both the sunflower sea star and the rich habitat it supports.

Through these collaborative efforts, aquariums are not only safeguarding this essential species but also helping to restore the health of kelp forests, which play a critical role in maintaining marine biodiversity and combating climate change. The Aquarium of the Bay is proud to be part of this hopeful and impactful mission.

## Attendance

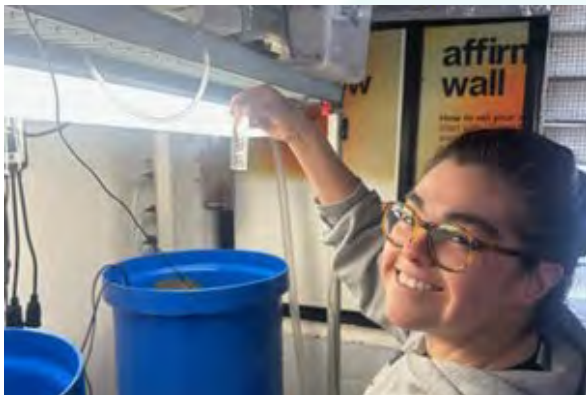
This past year, the Aquarium hosted over **260,000 visitors**. The Aquarium also hosted **9,152 students** along with their chaperones coming from **163 local schools**, a **43% increase** from 2022.

## New Exhibits and Animals



The **Eelgrass Bed exhibit** has been reimagined to showcase red octopuses with a pop-up bubble for immersive viewing. The former red octopus exhibit was transformed into a stunning temperate reef habitat with a wolf eel and anemones, with plans to add giant isopods and other deep-sea species in 2025.

The Animal Care team has also been hard at work on **new aquaculture initiatives**, including live food cultures and jelly species. These projects have improved sustainability and reduced our impact on wild populations.



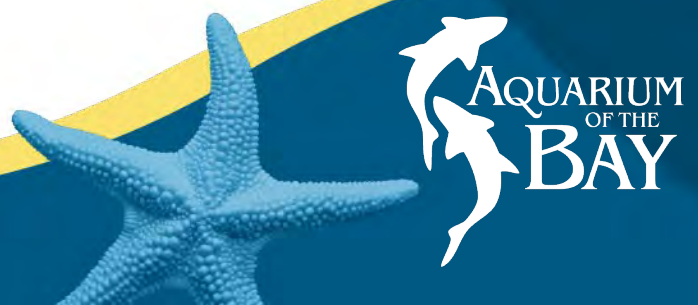
## Research and Conservation

Aquarium biologists made waves in shark research! Several staff members were recognized as co-authors or in the acknowledgements in two peer-reviewed studies on leopard sharks, contributing valuable insights into caring for these animals in captivity.



## Community Engagement

- The Aquarium connected with over 1,000 scouts at Scout O Rama, hosted military families for a special Blue Angels event, and participated in the Walk to End Alzheimer's.
- The Education Department partnered with The Marine Mammal Center and hosted a voluntourism group from South Korea.
- Education supported eight local schools in the Trout in the Classroom program, allowing teachers and students to rear eggs into alevin.

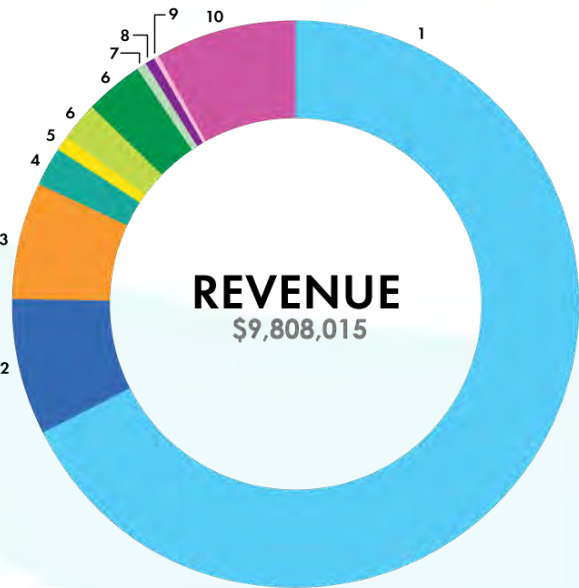
## Special Events

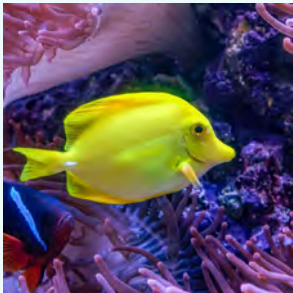
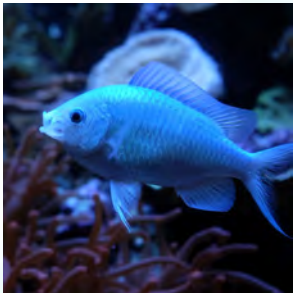

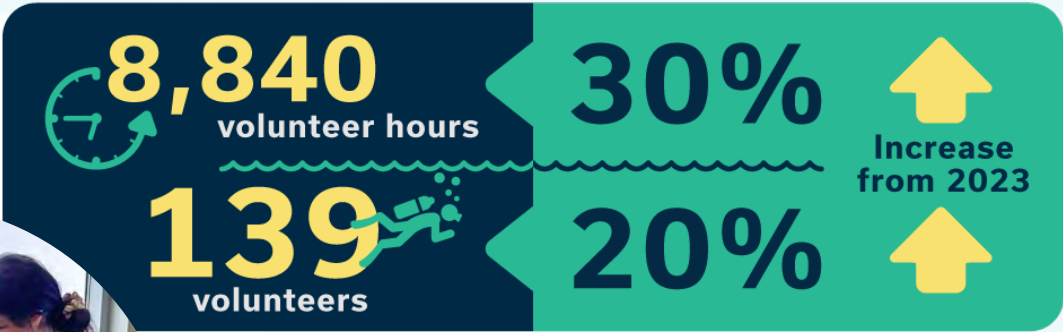

## Volunteer Highlights

As a small nonprofit, volunteers are the heart and soul of the Aquarium. We’re thankful for all the hours love and care they spend on animal care, diving, and education. We had increased volunteer participation this year with the addition of two new volunteer activities.



In April, our Students Educating about Aquatic Animals (SEA) program welcomed 14 and 15-year-olds, nurturing young marine enthusiasts. This initiative offers teens a chance to dive into marine biology, hone customer service skills, and gain valuable experience before blossoming into Youth Docents at 16.
